Township Engineer's Report June 8th, 2023

Active Projects:

1. Hickory Street turnback
 - **Project has been awarded to Morgan Excavating. HCEG is currently waiting on final contract paperwork and schedule from Morgan.**
 - **HCEG has been coordinating with utility companies to identify and survey the expected utility relocations.**
2. Act 537 Wastewater Management Plan
 - Plan preparation underway.
 - Township survey of properties is complete.
 - **We're currently working on the projected flow forecasts and will review with the Township prior to finalizing the 537 plan.**
3. MS4 Permit
 - Updated & Advertised PRP Plan has been submitted to DEP. No comments have been received yet.
 - New requirement is down to 1800' of stream restoration with no inlet filters.
 - We reduced the required pounds of sediment reduction from 204,152 lbs., 78,815 lbs. a 61% reduction in regulatory burden.
 - Based on recent bids for stream restoration projects this 61% reduction could mean a savings for the Township of \$500,000-\$1,500,000
 - **5 Year Renewal has been submitted and received by DEP. DEP stated their technical review may take up to 12 months.**
4. West Wylie Park
 - **Harshman prepared and submitted a grant to DCED's GTRP grant for Phase 1 Park Development. Decision expected in fall 2023.**
5. SR 844 Sanitary Sewer I&I Project
 - **HCEG has began preparing documents for the next phase of grouting the 844 interceptor.**
6. MS4 Stream Restoration – Logpile Run / Weirich Avenue
 - On hold for Legal Agreement with Mr. Byzant.
 - 1 year extension granted on DEP Growing Greener Grant.
7. Running Brooke
 - Building Permit approved and awaiting payment & pick-up by Permittee.

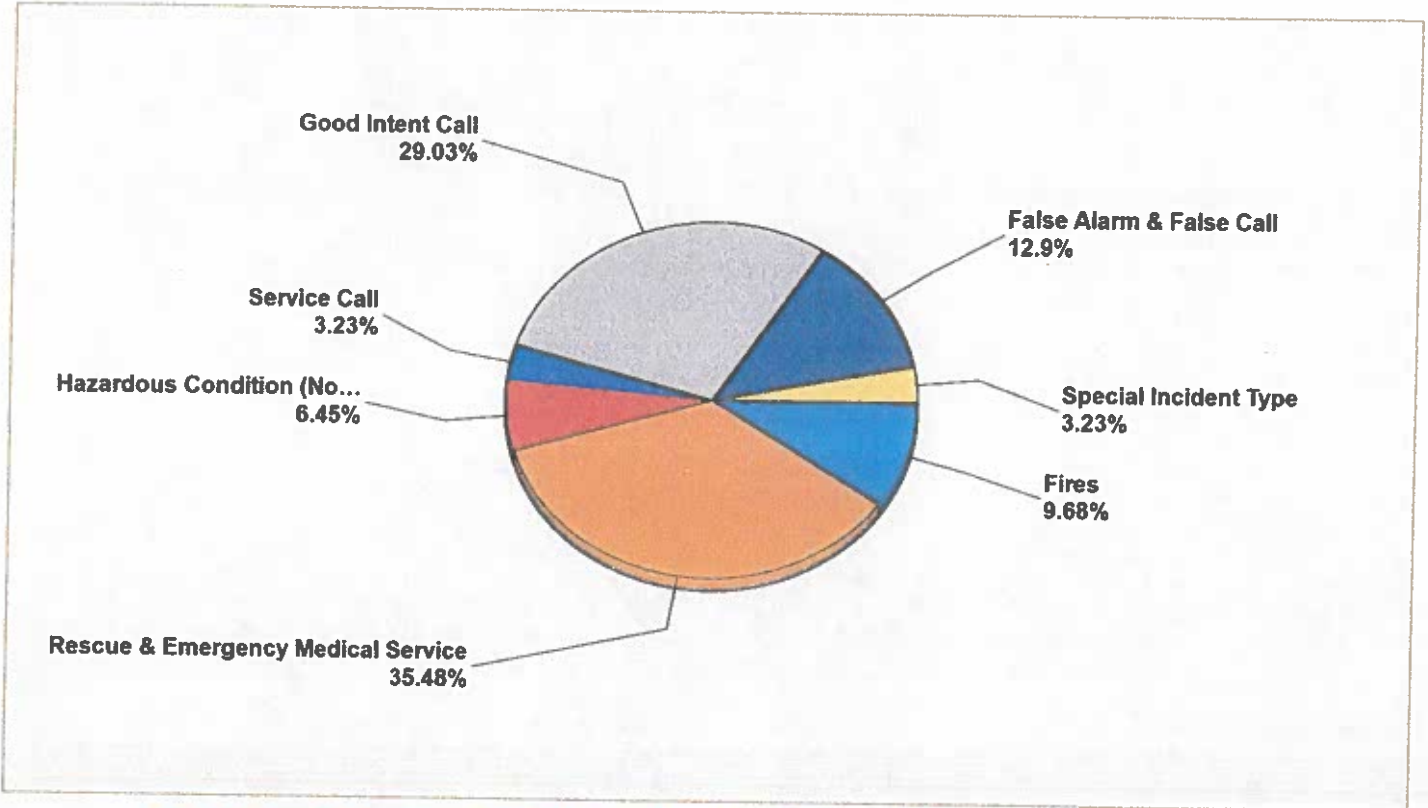
